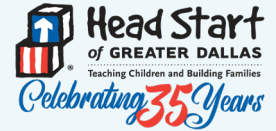


2023 HHS Eligibility Guidelines



Before you can enroll your child/children in the Head Start program; you must meet the US Department of Health and Human Services income guidelines. For example, for a family of 4, the total household income must be at or below \$30,000. Head Start of Greater Dallas will however accept families that are over this guideline by 10% only after all income eligible families are served.

For families/households with more than 8 persons, add \$6,430 for each additional person.
